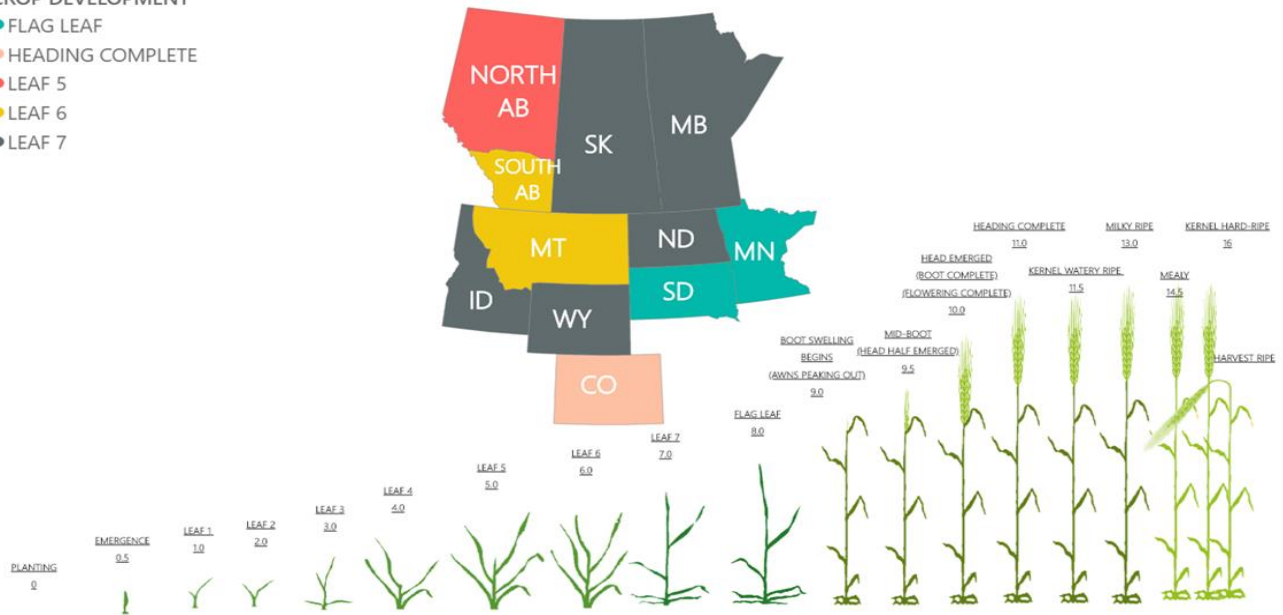

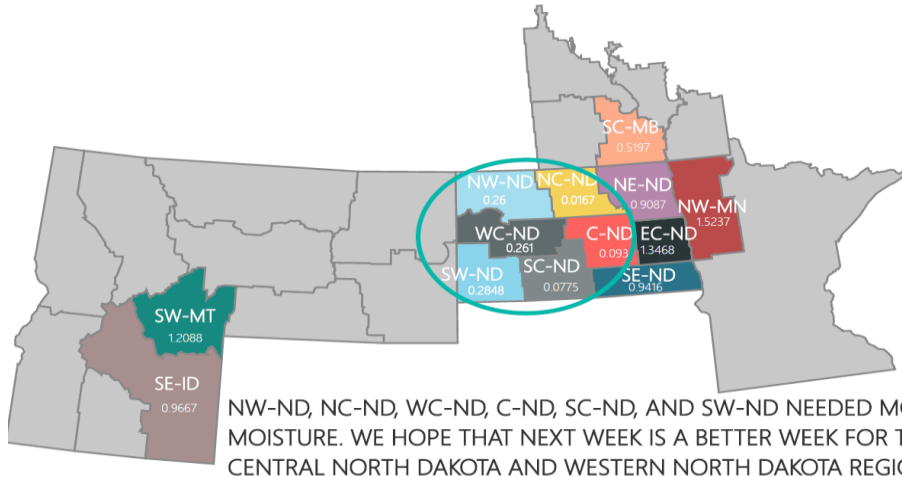
Head development at 6 leaf stage.

## Crop Conditions

Barley crops are generally excellent in Alberta. Extreme weather injured some crops as seen below. Hail and rain caused some physical damage to crops in areas. Excess rain caused soil erosion and ponding. Barley in water can only survive for a short time. Hotter dry weather is required.



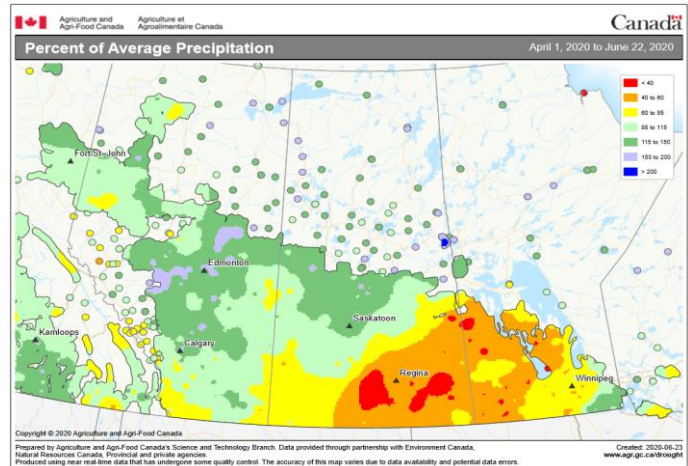
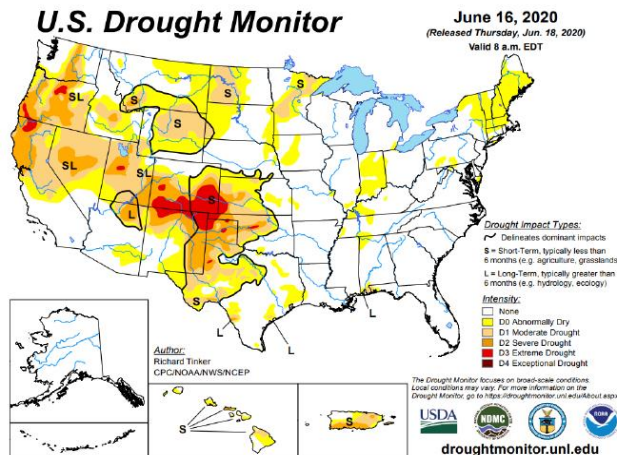
